# Creative Fibre Workshop Beyond Beginner Tablet Weaving Tutor: Sandra Brooks

# Creative Fibre Workshop Double-faced Tablet Woven Bands, Including Lettering Tutor: Sandra Brooks




#### Description

This technique can be used for both simple and complex designs. Weaving letters as well as an introduction to designing double-faced bands will also be included.
