I am never happier than with a pencil or a needle and thread in my hand, and some sort of experimental work challenging me to find a new way to communicate. With heaps of enthusiasm and encouragement, I hope to convey this sense of discovery and enjoyment to every class.

Workshop: Fabric Covered Journal

Description

In this workshop, you will make a fabulous fabric cover, stitched and embellished to your own design, and then we'll build the pages into the book with a simple and elegant binding.



The pages can be created from any papers you like. Sort through your stash and bring along drawing paper, wrapping paper, scrapbook paper, old envelopes, printed matter – anything you find interesting. During the workshop we will trim them to suit your book.

I will provide all the necessary equipment, and materials that will form the basis for the cover of your book. You can bring along your favourite fabrics and papers, and be ready to play and experiment.

Workshop: Finding Your Focus

Description

In my experience, brilliant ideas don't fall out of the blue. The planning process requires time and persistence. One thing leads to another, if you let it. But first, you need to find a way to start – listen for the murmur of a new idea, pick up the thread and follow it.

In this workshop, we will discover some of the skills and resources you can employ to generate ideas and plan new projects. We will discuss the many ways of collecting and developing relevant information, including keeping a workbook/visual diary. We'll think about how we can evoke a feeling or tell a story, with colour, form, and design.

Then we can put these skills into practise, to experience how they can work to support your own personal themes and interests.



Workshop: Secrets of the Scrolls

Description

Make your own scroll, elegant or funky, to keep, or to give away as a very special gift. Using small scraps of fabrics and papers and little embellishments, you will construct and decorate the fabric length for the scroll, and discover how to attach it to your reel. I will introduce some of my favourite tips and tricks to get you going. Come along with a theme in mind, or a collection of fabrics that will suggest a direction. Or just use all your most beautiful bits and pieces, in a fabulous conglomeration.

Workshop: Surface Tension

Description

Experiment with some of my favourite tricks and techniques, aimed at making your cloth more exciting and your stitch more expressive.

We will stitch (of course) and discuss printing on your fabric. We will rip, melt, and burn, layer, bond, and gild. Then you can play with combinations of these techniques to create luscious and diverse surfaces in samples of your own design.

Learning Outcomes Students will learn about:

- Adding another dimension with unique stitching to create depth and complexity, to transform the surface in many ways.
- Manipulating the cloth, making the materials work for effect, layering to create depth and illusion.
- Using a variety of methods to produce imagery and/or text on fabric to enhance the narrative quality of the work.
- Students will produce a series of small samples using techniques demonstrated, or have the option of beginning on a larger piece of work.
